MISSION DEBRIEFING: We took off and joined bomber stream without incident. Off coast of Holland, we were jumped by two nightfighters, one believed to been a JU88 and the second believed to be a Me110. The Ju88 made repeated passes at us and shot us up pretty good, the main damages being holing engine 1 and the oil leaking, rendering tail guns and ventral gun inoperable, and knocking out our oxygen. His "freund" in what we think was a 110 bounced us next, and his tracers set starboard outer fuel tank aflame. Jones ordered us to bail out, and set aerocraft into a starboard turn. I hit the water, it was damn cold, and lucky for me, I was almost immediately fished out by one of our MTB's. I was told to strip off my wet clothing, given a towel, some dry clothes and a hot cuppa. One of the MTB crew said they saw our bomber afire and falling. After a bit of a search, they couldn't find anyone else from DRUIDS REVENGE.
