

On the first pass the Do-117 was hit in the engine but failed to hit Bakers Dozen.

On its second pass the nose turret Hydraulic actuator was hit rendering it inoperable as well as damaging the Starboard Feed racks also disabling the gun.

Damage to the rear turret dead man switch resulting in FSGT Lightfoot unable to operate the escape hatch.

With 2 guns u/s, and the possibility of trapping the newest crew member in case of further damage to Bakers

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Dozen FLTLT Bainbridge decided the best course of action was to abort the mission.

Payload was jettisoned over the channel.
