For those of you following the second edition of Steve Dixon's Target For Tonight Campaign game, the date for this mission is the night of 10/11October 1943 and No. 104 Squadron is heading for Leverkusen, Germany. Here is "R for Roger's" Peenemunde mission AAR. Hope you enjoy!

## "The Mission to Leverkusen"....

The club was jumping tonight. An officer was pounding the piano keys, belting out an old favorite song. There were many of the bomber crews clustered around the piano. They were all trying to sing the old ballad. It was raucous and off key and many were drunk...

Teddy Fernsby sat at a table with his back to the wall slowly finishing a pint... the light was dim and the air was thick with cigarette smoke... He slowly looked around at all the new faces in the crowd... replacement crews for friends lost over the Continent.

"Were we ever that young?" Teddy asked looking over at "Binky" Williams, "R for Roger's navigator". "Binky" took a sip from his mug as he looked around at all the fresh young faces ... They had trained new pilots and transitioned them to the Lancaster after two tours on combat operations. They even had Special Operations time... They were posted to 617 Squadron flying against the Ruhr Dams back in May. "Binky" had honed his navigation skills to an elite level while we flew "on the deck" low level missions in 617 Squadron... He and "Binky" had just used those navigation and low level flying skills in their latest mission to Leverkusen.

The take off had gone smoothly Teddy remebered. The weather had been mostly clear across the channel and into the Netherlands... Navigation was easy and with the weather being clear Teddy

was able to follow the bomber stream moving along above them. They crossed the coast south of Rotterdam while flying "on-the-deck". The gunners set up their turrets for forward strafing as they had done when making their runs on the Mohne Dam in the Ruhr last May...

Teddy lowered the nose of "Roger", turned left and headed for the deck... Malcolm Fraser our flight engineer was looking out the canopy to our right ... "Looks like a Night Fighter got him." he said referring to the bomber just ahead of us on the bomb run that was breaking up ...

Teddy's thoughts were suddenly brought back to the here and now... "Binky" was getting up and trying to pull the Mug from his hand... "Hey!" he said "... do you want another one or not?" Teddy blinked a couple times and said "Yeah! ... On me" he said as he dug out a pound note and passed it to "Binky"...

Teddy's thoughts returned to the downed bomber that was ahead of them in the bomb run as "Binky" walked toward the bar... "P for Phoenix" he though... They didn't know which bomber had gone down until their return to base... "P for Phoenix" was one of the new crews... Teddy sighed he hadn't known any of them ...
