## "The Mission to Trappes...

No 104 Squadron led the bomber stream toward the rail yards at Trappes. WX was mostly clear with a storm front moving into the area on the return leg of the mission. Sporadic light AAA fire was encountered over France on both legs of the mission. One NF was encountered after crossing the French coastline. The NF made multiple passes. "Roger took evasive action and NF driven off. Disposition of the NF was inconclusive. The target was well marked by the pathfinders. "Over Target "Roger" checked in with the Master Bomber. AAA fire over the target was moderate. "Roger" sustained minor non-critical damage. "Roger" was cleared by the MB to bomb from low altitude and dropped on the initial bomb run. Strike photos showed 30% of the bombs were On-Target. No NFs encountered on the return leg of the mision. "Roger" landed without incident.

"R for Roger" will be ready for the next mission. 30% of the bombs dropped were On Target. There were no crew casualties.
